What was the Santee Indian Mound used for?

Name a species of bird once native to South Carolina that is now extinct.

What is a benefit to landscaping with native plants?

What early colonist is responsible for building and developing the Native American deerskin trade? What important seeds did he plant from Madagascar?

What do you call mammals and birds that can generate their own heat and stay active year-round?
