

Transcript 7 Days in Jail

Interviewer: Were you involved in the Civil Rights Movement, directly or indirectly?

Wayman Stover: Yes, I, I have been involved in many ways. Of course I joined the movement, joined the NAACP when I was in college and also uh, in the 60's. I'm not sure exactly what year it was. I'm thinking it was 1963 it may have been '62 but I'm thinking it was '63 when we had the march in Orangeburg we were marching for desegregated uh, lunch counters at that time.

And uh, we marched. I think it was during the fall of the year when we were marching. Matter of fact I knew when it was, after some time that the World Series was going on. (*Laughs*) Los Angeles, Los Angeles Dodgers played the New York Yankees I believe that year. And uh, we were arrested. I was arrested, and uh I spent seven days in jail as a result of that demonstration and I remember it because we watched the entire World Series (*laughs*)
