Lynn Cornfoot - South Carolina ETV

Cornfoot: So over at ETV, I work in the EFP Department, which stands for Electronic Field Production. And I am an electronic field specialist, which basically is a fancy word for videographer. And I am the only woman in this department—uh, I work with eight guys. And it's great, you know. Um, I think that they might've had a little reservation about a lady coming into this place, but, uh, I have since calmed their fears and we all get along really nicely. And they're a great group of guys. More often than not, we are out in the field shooting different documentaries, um, and educational pieces for ETV.

I'm working on this really great documentary right now, called Remember My Name, and it's about domestic violence. And we've got a really good team, uh, for this show. It's very...it's very heavy, but I think that it's going to do a lot of...a lot of good, um, to educate people on this problem here in South Carolina.

I think you can make a living as a media professional here in Columbia or in South Carolina. One of the things that has helped for me is, you know, being able to work all of those different positions...to know the ins and outs of the business and, and what each person does, and to have that, um, experience under my belt, so to speak. I am just floating on the winds of media, wherever it takes me.
